

Desire to Know

Pure desire

is reality with which one had been gaining ever greater familiarity in process of self-appropriation

cannot repeat the book here

reasonably
'one cannot desire to attain what one knows one cannot attain'

attainment in question is via ~~xxxx~~ exercise of one's own intelligence and one's own reasonableness

it includes knowing what one can know and what one cannot know not two questions but one: I can know x means that I cannot is a mistake, and vice versa

if one can ask about both what one can and what one cannot know then at least the asking is unrestricted

Gregorianum 55¹ 1974 139:

"An 'unrestricted desire' in man could not possibly have as its correlative the concept or idea of being as described in (d, e, k, 1[4]). Why? Because a human desire ~~ix~~ to know is intelligible only in terms of the possible fulfilment of the desire."

Fulfilment of pure desire includes

Promotion of consciousness

Asking qq for intelligence, recognizing insufficiency, putting further qq

Asking questions for reflection, recognizing suff and insuff, further qq

Using unanswered qq as clues^u to solutions

answers and lack of answers

techniques and limitations of techniques to work out 'critique'

Self regulation on basis of determined limits

where determination supposes basic spontaneous illimitation
