1. Tolomeo von Lucca, Bernard Guidonis, Stamser Katalog attribute De fato to Aquinas.  
Grabmann (348) admits these attributions, maintains w Pelster and MSS attributions that De fato is Albert's.
2. Of Codices attribution to Aquinas of Op 14 found in Brugge, Avignon Bordeaux Vat lat 807 813 Sorbonne 1190
3. But explicit attribution to Aquinas of Op 13 found in Brugge Bordeaux Vat lat 807 813 Sorbonne 1190
4. Avignon contains only works Mandonnet held spurious namely, 56 62 51 53 54 52 50; Rom nn 36 14 29 42 42 32 37
5. Bordeaux further has Rom n 53 De intellectu et intelligibili.
6. Genovefabibliothek without naming Thomas: 36 14 29 42 41 32 39 72 except 39 explicit names Thomas  
espec
7. Grabmann ready to recant/in MS proof agst him p 238
8. Argues at length for De Fallaciis 227-37  
  
Does not seem too critical: if work he wants in middle of explicitly attributed, fine; if spurious in middle of explicitly attributed, passed over.  
Does not seem to evaluate value of testimonies.
9. Catalogue of Cod Vat lat 807 (115) lists among works of st. Thomas "De natura caelestis corporis" and "De natura syllogismorum" which Grabmann does not include even among the spurious works

c Grabmann urges value of testimony of this MS because  
it distinguishes between Aquinas, Thomas Anglicus, and  
leaves other works anonymous. (136-38)

content with early 14th. (140)

fol 4<sup>r</sup>: Incipit liber de verbo eiusdem.  
Follows Op 14, Mand 62. (143)

c Contains 7 opuscula attributed to St Thomas, and a much

3. Cod 253 der Bibliothek von Avignon.

a Earlier than preceding; early 14th. (146)

b Contains 33 35 39 55 56 30 31 41 42 32 47 38  
Underlined are attributed to Aquinas; others are anonymous in MS;  
47 is not the printed "De demonstracione natura syllogismorum"

4. Cod 131 der Bibliothek von Bordeaux. (contains very important parts)

a 14th century (150)

b Attributes to Aquinas and contains 53 13 14 Mand nn 63 61, 62

5. Cod # 238 der Genovefabibliothek zu Paris (Ste Genevieve) (157)
- a Beginning of 14th, perhaps end of 13th cent. (157)
- b Contains series of Thomist opuscula of which ~~13~~ 12 are attributed to Frater Thomas. All of these in official catalogue except Expositio in Ave Maria.  
 Next Albert's de Fato as ~~mixx~~ Alberts (159, 348) /72  
 There follow a series of opuscula, Rom nn. 36 14 29 42 41 32 39/  
 Only one of these attributed to Aquinas, namely, 39 De fallaciis which in the explicit mentions his name "Expliciunt fallacie fratris Thome" (160)  
 Mandonnet makes a great deal of this winnowing of wheat from chaff p 163 f; Grabmann not convinced
6. Cod 225, Corpus Xti College, Oxford (164 ff)
- a Beginning of 14th cent. (164 calc)
- b Includes "De verbo" opusc 14 without naming Thomas (168)  
 17 other opusc: Rom nn 14 16 21 25 27 29-37 inc, 40-42 69 though not in that order  
 ?Includes in midst of genuine Thomist works other works without title that are not thomist; perhaps De partibus organicis (165)
7. Cod Vat lat 807 (130)
- a About 1323 (171)
- b Incipiunt opuscula fratris Thomae de Aquino ordinis fratrum praedicatorum... (171) /ES, (178)  
 Follow 38 opuscula; contains only Thomist work; unlike preceding  
 (173) Op 14 Mand 62  
 (174) Op 13 Mand 61  
 Type of "unum volumen" mentioned by Thomeo de Lucca, Bernard Guidonis (179)  
 Bernard subsequent (184)
8. Cod 1190 der Sorbonne. (184)
- a 13th century (184)
- b used by Quetif-Echard, but now numbers changed, unavailable
- c explicitly attributes Op 13 14 to Aquinas.
