You will recall that the Rev. Paul C. Reinert, S.J., President of the University wrote you indicating that the undersigned would contact you regarding the details of the University Sesquicentennial conference "Theology in the City of Man" to be held October 15-17, 1968 at Saint Louis University. Enclosed you will find the Conference program. You will note that all the principal speakers, commentators and chairmen of seminar sessions have accepted with one exception.

The two public addresses are tentatively scheduled to be held at Powell Symphony Hall, Grand and Delmar. Enclosed is a map of the campus indicating the places where the conference will be held.
