

Biography of Speakers, Jesuit Institute, 1970

Reverend John L. McKenzie, S.J., is a Biblical scholar and currently professor of theology at the University of Notre Dame. He did graduate work at Saint Louis University, Saint Mary's, Kansas, and Weston College in Massachusetts, receiving his doctorate in sacred theology there in 1946. Father McKenzie has taught at West Baden College, Loyola University of Chicago, and was a visiting professor of Old Testament at the University of Chicago. He is a former president of both the Catholic Biblical Association and the Society of Biblical Literature. Several books are among his publications, the latest being The Roman Catholic Church (1969). Father McKenzie was awarded the Cardinal Spellman Theology Award in 1967 and an honorary Litt.D. from Bucknell University in 1969.

Reverend Bernard J. F. Lonergan, S.J., is a Professor of Dogmatic Theology and presently on the faculty of Regis College, Willowdale, Ontario. He completed his graduate work at the Gregorian University in 1940, receiving a doctorate in sacred theology. Father Lonergan taught at the Gregorian University from 1953 to 1965. Among his many publications have been several books, perhaps most famous of these being Insight, A Study of Human Understanding first published in 1957. Father Lonergan was honored by Pope Paul VI in 1969 when he was made a member of the Pontifical Theological Commission.

Reverend Ladislav M. Orsy, S.J., is Chairman of the Department and Professor of Theology at Fordham University. He was born in Hungary and received his licentiate in theology at Louvain, an A.M. in Jurisprudence from Oxford University and a doctorate in Canon Law from the Gregorian University in 1957. Father Orsy is presently chairman of the Research and Study Committee of the Canon Law Society of America. He is also a member of the Canonist Society of Great Britain. He recently published Open to the Spirit (1968) and has prepared a book on theology of law in the Church to be published this year. Father Orsy has contributed numerous articles and reviews to professional journals in the United States and in Europe.

Reverend John L. Thomas, S.J., is currently a research associate at the Cambridge Center for Social Studies. He did graduate work at the University of Montreal and at the University of Chicago where he received a doctorate in Sociology in 1949. Father Thomas was a Professor of Sociology at Saint Louis University from 1949 to 1965. In 1952 he was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship; in 1959 he was elected president of the Catholic Sociological Society. He has authored several books on the Catholic family and contributed numerous articles to European and American journals.

Reverend John R. McCall, S.J., is presently the Director of Personnel for the New England Province of the Society of Jesus. He did graduate work at Weston College and at the Catholic University of America where he received his doctorate in Clinical Psychology. Father McCall is a Professor of Psychology and Spiritual Director at Weston College and Professor of Psychology and Clinical Child Guidance in the Graduate School of Boston College. Among his publications are several articles on the relationship between psychology and religion. He is a very popular lecturer and has traveled widely.

Reverend Donald R. Campion, S.J., is a sociologist and currently editor-in-chief of the national Catholic weekly America and president of America Press, Inc. He completed his undergraduate studies at Saint Louis University and his theological studies at Woodstock College. Father Campion earned his doctorate in sociology at the University of Pennsylvania. He is a member of several professional organizations and has contributed to more than a dozen books on social theory, the sociology of religion, and ecumenical and interreligious affairs. During 1965-66 he directed a socio-pastoral experiment in an inner-city parish on Manhattan's Lower East Side. As editor-in-chief of America he has had occasion to keep in close touch with developments in the Church, having recently covered the proceedings at the Special Synod of Bishops in Rome.

Reverend Vincent J. O'Flaherty, S.J., is currently Director of Novices for the Missouri Province of the Society of Jesus. He completed his undergraduate studies at Rockhurst College and then served for more than two years as an officer in the U. S. Navy during World War II. Father O'Flaherty earned his doctorate in Spiritual Theology at the Catholic University of America in 1961. His dissertation topic was "The Spirituality of St. Ignatius Loyola and the Layman." Before becoming Novice Director Father O'Flaherty was Province Director of Sodalties and Spiritual Director at Fusz Memorial.
