THE INSTITUTE

The Institute is planned to be co-operative in character. With this approach it is hoped that the intellectual resources of the members of the Institute as well as the director will be brought to bear on the conclusions reached. Morning sessions will be essentially the philosopher speaking to educators much as a biologist would speak to a medical doctor, a mathematician to a physicist. In these conferences it is expected the bases for a philosophy of education will be established. The evening sessions will reverse

this process. The representatives of the other disciplines will test the application of the principles,—refining, integrating or challenging the philosopher's stand. It is important to note that the lectures will not presuppose extensive knowledge of the field of philosophy. Rather, they will appeal to a constructive kind of intelligence capable of following the gradual assembly of the elements into an enriched and deepened view of concrete educational activity.

FATHER LONERGAN

The director, Father Bernard J. F. Lonergan, S.J., will come from Rome especially for the Institute. There he is Professor of Theology at the famed Gregorian University. He is author of the stimulating, profound and controversial work *INSIGHT*,

considered by some the topmost book on Thomistic philosophy of recent times. He brings an unusual intelligence and genius to the problems of the Philosophy of Education together with a deep desire to see sound pedagogical methods at work in teaching.

GENERAL INFORMATION

TIME AND PLACE. The Institute will take place from Monday, August 3 to Friday, August 14, 1959. Sessions will be held in the Albert D. Cash Memorial Conference Room on the Xavier University campus. Morning sessions, 9:00 to 11:00, will consist of lectures by Father Lonergan. Evening sessions beginning at 8:00 will be devoted to discussion and workshop.

HOUSING. Priests, brothers, and laymen will be housed in Elet Hall, Winding Way. Religious sisters will be housed in Brockman Hall, Ledgewood Drive. Lay women will be housed in Elet Hall Annex, Winding Way.

SPECIAL FEATURES. Because the Xavier University campus is in the geographical center of

Cincinnati, participants in the Institute will have easy accessibility to the many cultural and recreational opportunities of the metropolitan area. Special programs will be planned by the Institute staff.

COST. The registration fee for the Institute is \$40.00. Food and lodging described above under Housing, are offered at \$5.00 per day.

APPLICATION. Registration is limited to 50 persons. A blank for your convenience accompanies this announcement.

GRADUATE CREDIT. Those applicants wishing to qualify for two hours of graduate credit must submit transcript and properly register.
