Father Bernard Lonergan, Professor of Theology at Boston College, will present Lectures on 2, 3 and 4 March 1976 at Queen's University at Kingston.

Father Lonergan is a Canadian Jesuit philosopher and theologian of international repute and renown. A graduate of the University of London, Father Lonergan received his S.T.D. from the Gregorianum before returning to his native Quebec as Professor of Theology at L'Immaculée Conception, Montreal. He has continued a long and highly distinguished teaching career mainly at Regis College, Toronto, and at the Gregorianum in Rome.

Father Lonergan is the author of numerous articles and papers; his published works include *Verbum: word and idea in Aquinas* (1967) and *Method in Theology* (1972). However he is most widely known for his major work *Insight: A study of human understanding* (1957) which represented a landmark in philosophical thinking and opened a new pattern for creative philosophical and theological method. Establishment of the 1st International Lonergan Conference in Florida during 1970 testifies to the increasing importance and significance attached to Father Lonergan's thought and work.

The Lectures are sponsored by the Donald Mathers Memorial Lecture-ship Committee, and the public is invited to all sessions.

Father Lonergan's lectures constitute the third series of lectures sponsored by the Donald Mathers Memorial Lectureship, a trust created by friends after the death of the late Principal of Queen's Theological College.
