

Method in Christology

The Way to Nicea studies the basic development of Christological thought in its shifting linguistic usage, thought-forms, and dialectical transitions from Palestinian Judaism to Nicea. Christology Today reviews post-medieval developments in psychology, philosophy, and history; distinguishes religious and theological questions; clarifies the meaning of Chalcedon; seeks a reconciliation of Christ's human development and divine identity.

First, a detailed study of the dialectic that moved Christian ~~thought~~ thought from its early Palestinian expressions to the definition of Nicea. Secondly, contemporary pressures for change from psychology, philosophy, history; a distinction between religious and theological issues; a clarification of the term, person.
