Dear Dr. Lonergan,

As you may know, the XIVth International Congress of the International Association for the History of Religions will be held at the University of Manitoba, Winnipeg, from August 17 to 21, 1980. One of its Sections will be devoted to the Philosophy of Religion, and I am writing this letter to you as Co-ordinator for this Section. Professor Cathleen Going, of the Thomas More Institute in Montreal is my colleague on this committee.

We are enquiring whether it would be possible for you to present a paper to one of the meetings of our Section.
