From causality - 5 ways

Max. Sc. statistical correlations

combine correlations with boundary conditions  $\left| \begin{matrix} \text{Time} \\ \text{Space} \end{matrix} \right| \rightarrow \text{result.}$

But boundary conditions are conditional; conditions anywhere in universe  
Causality? If universe in situation A and then follows sit.. B

Then if A were to occur, B once more would follow

Causality in this sense does not lead to a transcendent cause  
Insight from possibility of an intelligible world

Five ways

II 16th century of God exists, he can do anything that does not involve a contradiction

he is a contradiction if one claims that  
A exists and is present to my intuition and A does not exist  
or A is not present to my intuition  
A exists

But he is no contradiction if one claims it is true that  
that I intuit A as both present and existing  
and that A neither exists nor is present
