## QUESTIONE FOR DISCUSSION

The first function of the "transcendental method" is listed as being the normative function, and given are the four "transcendental precepts":

 (1) be attentive, (2) be intelligent;
 (3) be reasonable, (4) be responsible.

Now, if "reasonable" means a critical rationality, then the judgment that this implies seems to cloud the distinction between rationality and responsibility. Both rationality and responsibility would seem to imply the taking of a personal stand towards that which the intellect has grasped. What is the difference between critical rationality and responsibility?
