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The history of art

Not for the sake of this history itself but for the sake of the fuller undersanding of man and of history which can be had from the fact that there is understood what art is – analysis what the function of art is in human life

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The function of art

1 The Greeks invented the logos

as reason

as definition

as science

and thus expelled mythos
